



MAP Volunteer Position Description

Our Medical Accompaniment Program (MAP) is an opportunity for community members to be trained as volunteer advocates and provide immediate crisis intervention and support to survivors of sexual assault in Nashville during the evidence collection exam process and/or reporting to police. Although some of our volunteers are students seeking a meaningful experience while gaining service hours for their organization or degree program, we welcome volunteers from all walks of life and all types of experience, who are 18 years or older.

Reports To: SAFE Clinic Administrator

Major Duties Include:

- Participate in Medical Accompaniment Program by assuming clinic coverage responsibilities to respond to sexual assault victims seeking medical legal exams.
- Maintain appropriate and thorough documentation and electronic records.
- Attend Criminal Injuries Victims Compensation training every 3 years.
- Maintain supportive contact with the survivor and appropriate parent/guardian, on an intensive basis, throughout the service delivery period.
- Always abide by confidentiality policy.

Qualifications:

- Volunteers must be 18 years of age or older.
- Individuals who have experienced sexual violence within the past 5 years are excluded from participation eligibility.
- All volunteers are required to attend a thirty-hour orientation and commit to three six-hour shifts a month. The orientation is alternately based during the evening of weekdays over two weeks or over two weekends and alternates to be able to accommodate people with different schedules.
